



The CARB Rule Deadlines Are Here

Four short years ago, "CARB" was not a word that most movers had in their vocabulary. As this first compliance year comes to an end, many movers were hoping for another ending to the story. Maybe something like "the stockings were hung by the chimney with care, and a court injunction was handed down because the movers' new equipment budget was really quite bare." Alas, there is no indication of further delays and many van lines and agents are under the gun to comply with the first retrofit or replacement deadline at the end of this year. Also, the CARB initial reporting date is January 31, 2012 for the Truck and Bus Rule. CMSA

and CleanFleets.net want to make sure that CMSA members have current information and the following summarizes the final rulemaking process and how to comply and report.

Rule Process

The final step in the CARB legal process is the same that is required of all regulations under the state Administrative Procedures Act. CARB has produced the "final" Truck and Bus Rule language and the final review by state lawyers will be done by December 14.



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The CMSA Pinnacle Award

The Pinnacle Award will be presented by the California Moving and Storage Association (CMSA) to one mover member. This award is designed to honor an outstanding company whose commitment to ethical business practices help to portray the Moving and Storage Industry in a positive light within the community.

The Pinnacle Award criteria are broken into four categories that closely correlate with the CMSA Code of Ethics. A company should demonstrate its commitment to high ethical standards of behavior and provide documentation in all categories:

- 1. **Management Practices.** Demonstrate your company's commitment to encourage and develop the highest levels of industry service quality, and to promote the lawful best interest of our industry, association and craft. Also demonstrate your commitment to operate as a responsible employer and to encourage your employees to behave honorably and responsibly as they represent our industry and our companies. Examples of items you may wish to include are:
 - Pertinent sections from an employee handbook or company manual showing how quality and ethics policies are communicated to employees.
 - Information about office policies and training programs (formal or informal), which communicate ethics policies and practices to employees.
 - Employee benefits, such as health and profit sharing plans, bonuses, employee of the month programs or any "family friendly" workplace practices such as picnics or barbeques.
- 2. **Marketing, Advertising and Sales Practices.** Demonstrate your company's commitment to participate in advertising that only portrays your services in an honest and fair manner. Examples of items you may wish to include are:
 - Yellow page advertisements, copy of company website, coupons or brochures.
 - Sales practices and training that ensure customers clearly understand what they are purchasing and that your sales practices are honest and ethical.
 - Company practice for rectifying customer complaints.
- 3. **Customer and Vendor Relations.** Demonstrate how you work with customers, vendors and trade associates in only the most honorable ways. Examples of items you may wish to include are:
 - Complimentary letters or evaluations from customers.
 - Customer service policies that ensure customer satisfaction and demonstrates accountability to your customers and vendors.
 - Examples of action by your company to correct a mistake discovered by you or your staff. Examples of action that have been "beyond the call of duty" to fix a problem in the service provided by your company.

- 4. **Community Service.** Demonstrate how your company works within the community to promote the moving and storage industry in a positive light. Examples of items you may wish to include are:
 - Articles in trade or industry publications that reflect your reputation as an ethical business.
 - Awards or recognition for charitable and/or community service projects.
 - Complimentary letters from industry peers or community leaders.

The four criteria will be judged equally, each assigned a maximum point value of ten, for a total of 40 points. The judges will be objective industry leaders from outside the moving and storage industry.

The deadline for entries is February 17, 2012 with the award to be presented at the Awards Luncheon during the CMSA Annual Convention, April 14, 2012 in Sparks, Nevada.

How to Comply

There has been no change proposed by CARB to the critical dates approved by the Board (those described at the CMSA workshops and 2011 Annual Meeting) and truck owners need to: 1) determine how the end of year deadline requires them to ret-

rofit or retire trucks, 2) take action by December 31, and 3) collect truck and engine data and report by the January 31, 2012 deadline.

How to Report

The CARB Truck and Bus Upload and Compliance Reporting System (TRUCRS) is temporarily unavailable due to maintenance. CARB expects

that the system will be available the week of December 12th, which they expect should provide fleets sufficient time to report by the deadline of January 31, 2012. The CARB webpage at the link below will be updated when the system is available, or you may sign up for our Truck and Bus Regulation Program Listserve at the link to

receive notification when it is online. See http://www.arb.ca.gov/msprog/onrdiesel/reportinginfo.htm.

Supply Chain Issue

Timely reporting is essential for fleet owners to obtain the Certificate of Reported Compliance. In order to avoid the penalties that can

be extracted for dispatching non-compliant trucks, all parties in the moving and storage supply chain should be prepared to ask for, or furnish, the CARB certificate. Clean-Fleets.net is also providing services to several van lines and dozens of CMSA members in order to collect accurate data, compile the initial report obtain the compliance certificate, prepare a Fleet

Analysis using all legal credits or extensions under the Rule and providing ongoing support relating to CARB.

SDDC Personal Property Forum

The Surface Deployment & Distribution Command (SDDC) held its fall Personal Property Forum (PPF) at the Regency Conference Center in O'Fallon, Ill., on Tuesday, November 1, 2011. The meeting was well attended with over 200 TSPs and Agents that were very interested in the DP3 Program.

The meeting opened with SDDC Commander Master General Kevin Leonard speaking very highly of the cooperative effort needed between the TSPs and the military in this program. He warned us about the cost cutting efforts that the military will be facing in the near future and how it will affect transportation of the military member.

Lt. Col. Oliver took it from there and said that the 2011 Peak Season was better than anticipated, and hoped that by 2012, they will have all the bugs worked out of the system. Some of the other topics Col. Oliver reviewed were:

Personal Property Program Outsourcing

The U.S. Secretary of Defense is in the process of having a feasibility study done for outsourcing the DOD Personal Property Program. Col. Oliver indicated that the contractor, Logistics Management Institute (LMI), was examining the program and gathering information right now and is to have the results to the SDDC by April 2012. We can only guess what a financial and logistical nightmare this would be if outsourcing occurs.

Common Financial Administration and/or Control (CFAC)

Col. Oliver briefly addressed this topic, CFAC, and he provided us with an initial outline of CFAC guidelines which are to be incorporated into the Personal Property Program and are looking to the industry for input. He went on to say that SDDC is looking for a way to cut the number of approved TSPs in each channel. SDDC knows this works well in the overseas

system, and they see no reason why it can't be incorporated in the domestic system. This is the time for you as TSPs and Agents to get to know your Congress member.

Claims Module

It was indicated by Mary Meyer Campbell, Program Manager of the Joint Program Management Office for Household Goods System (JPMO HHGS), that the claims module will be rewritten, and that the industry will be included to provide input. There was also talk of the military member claiming directly to the TSP, but then the military would lose its ability to track claims. The military was also looking at the pos-

sibility of buying a claims program "off the shelf." It's anybody's guess right now on which way this will go.

Digital Certificates

Judy Fowler, Program Manager of the ETA and System Response Center, discussed security issues and the digital certificate requirement. She indicated that there was still concern about the ability of individuals located outside of CONUS to obtain the digital certificates. A plan should be in place in January 2012 for this. She also reiterated that every TSP, Agent, insurance/bond, CPAs, third party billing and claims teams must have digital certificates to access the DPS system as of October 2011.





actually crawl through tunnels in a model of the Berlin Wall. Also worth noting was the replica of the Oval Office, in which President Reagan insisted that the museum floors be lowered so that the dimensions were exact to the real

Oval Office.

The tour concluded outside the museum at President Ronald Reagan's burial site. The inscription on his memorial reads:

I know in my heart that man is good. That what is right will eventually triumph. And there is purpose and worth to every life.

Fittingly, an actual piece of the Berlin wall stands next to his gravesite.

According to Bernadette Lance, "The weather was beautiful, and we had a great crowd. I think everyone had a fantastic experience."

The event was organized by Jack Fishel of the CMSA Ventura/ Santa Barbara Chapter and raised over \$1,300 for the Scholarship Fund. Many thanks to all who attended.

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
