PRESIDENT'S COMMENTS

California Household Goods Carriers are in the middle of a monumental regulatory change. Our industry has been regulated by the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) since 1923. To

put that into perspective here are a few of the things that were going on in 1923: President Warren G. Harding, died in office of a heart attack and was succeeded by Vice President Calvin Coolidge, who became the 30th President of the United States. The Union of Socialist Soviet Republics (USSR) was established. The World Population was ~ 1,999,000,000. The Firestone Company puts their inflatable tires into production and Insulin first became generally available for use by diabetics. In California: A major fire in Berkeley consumed some 640 structures, including 584 homes in the densely built neighborhoods north of the campus of the

University of California. Roy and Walt Disney founded The Walt Disney Company. The Hollywoodland sign was inaugurated, when rebuilt in 1949, it became The Hollywood sign.

Effective July 1, 2018, California Movers will begin a new era of regulation by the California Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA). First, notice that I use the term "Movers" as opposed to "Household Goods Carriers." This language change is a small, but reasonable change that SB 19, the Senate bill that transferred authority (one of several made), at the request of the California Moving and Storage Association (CMSA). No consumer who is contemplating a move asks Google or Siri to find them a Household Goods Carrier. There is an unbelievable amount of issues that need to be addressed during the transfer as well as working to ensure that one regulator continues to serve the public and industry until another takes over. CMSA is the only party lobbying for the best possible outcome for legal movers and the moving public. CMSA leadership, board and staff, have worked



Governor Brown Delivers 2018 State of the State Address: "California is Setting the Pace for America"

SACRAMENTO – Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. delivered his 16^{th} – and final – State of the State address today asserting that the "bolder path is still our way forward" on climate change, infrastructure investment, health care, education and criminal justice.



forts of firefighters, first responders and volunteers who "answered the call to help their fellow neighbors" this year and the "profound and growing challenge" of extreme weather and fires in California.

In his remarks, the Governor pointed to a number of far-reaching, bipartisan measures passed in recent years – from pension and workers' compensation reform to the Water Bond, Rainy Day Fund and the Cap-and-Trade Program – that demonstrate "some American governments can actually get things done."

Governor Brown also recognized the ef-

Citing "endless new weapons systems, growing antagonism among nations, the poison in our politics, climate change" and the <u>Bulletin of the Atomic Scientists "Doomsday Clock"</u> moving 30 seconds closer to catastrophe, the Governor warned that "our world, our way of life, our system of governance" are all at "immediate and genuine risk" and called "for courage, for imagination and for generous dialogue" from Californians.



California Compliance with Federal REAL ID Act Requirements

FACT SHEET



IMPORTANT DATES

January 22, 2018: California DMV began offering REAL ID driver license and identification cards.

October 1, 2020:

Federal compliant card required to board an airplane or enter military bases or certain federal facilities

More information on REAL ID is available on the DMV website at REALID.dmv.ca.gov.



DL 1010 (NEW 1/2018)

Under the REAL ID Act, the California DMV must meet requirements set by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security for its driver licenses and identification cards to be accepted for federal purposes.

How the REAL ID Act Impacts Californians

Beginning October 1, 2020, the federal government will require your driver license or ID card to be REAL ID compliant if you wish to use it as identification to board a domestic flight or to enter military bases and most federal facilities. The California DMV is now offering federal compliant REAL ID driver licenses or ID cards to customers.

Do I Need a REAL ID?

If you have a valid U.S. Passport or U.S. Passport Card, military ID, or other form of Transportation Security Administration (TSA) approved identification, you may use it as your form of identification to pass TSA airport checkpoints nationwide and to visit a secure federal building or military base. Check the TSA website at www.tsa.gov for a complete list of approved identification.

If you know you will not be boarding a domestic flight or visiting a secure federal facility or military base, you do not need a REAL ID driver license or ID card.

You DO NOT need a REAL ID to:

- Drive
- Apply for or receive federal benefits (Veterans Affairs, Social Security Administration, etc.)
- Enter a federal facility that does not require ID (i.e., a post office)
- Visit a hospital or receive life-saving services

Those under 18 are not required to have a REAL ID to fly.

Who is Eligible for a REAL ID?

U.S. citizens and all legal residents of the United States can apply for a REAL ID driver license or ID card.

How to Prepare for REAL ID

To apply for a REAL ID card:

- Make an appointment to visit a DMV field office (recommended)
- Proof of identity (examples: U.S. birth certificate, U.S. passport, employment authorization document, permanent resident card or foreign passport with an approved form I-94)
- Proof of Social Security Number (examples: SSN card, W-2, paystub with full SSN)
- California residency document (examples: utility bill, rental agreement, mortgage bill, medical document)
- A name change document, such as a marriage certificate, may be required.

Original documents or certified copies are required. For more information, visit REALID.dmv.ca.gov.

What Does a REAL ID Look Like?

A REAL ID driver license and ID card will have a special marking in the top right corner of the card. The marking is the California grizzly bear with a star.

California Driver License and Identification Card Redesign

The California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) is redesigning the driver license and identification (DL/ID) card. Effective January 22, 2018, DMV will begin producing the DL/ID card with the new card design.

REAL ID Card

Marking: California Grizzly bear with a star appears in the upper right corner.

Here is a look at the card designs and some important features:

- Gold miner image in the bottom right corner of the card.
- California poppies appear on the bottom left of the card.
- Under ultraviolet "UV" light, UV image of the cardholder photo, the UV image of birth date, and the UV image of the Golden Gate Bridge and Coit Tower appears.
- 4. New Veteran Designation design.
- 5. The "California" header changed.

Employers Can Keep Drug-Free Workplace, Despite Weed Legalization

California's new law on recreational marijuana can create some difficulties for employers. This law was enacted in 2017, but as of January 1, 2018, people in California now have the right to sell and/or purchase marijuana.

Émployees may think they can use marijuana and come in to work; however, the law is unchanged in one regard: Employers have the right to have employees who are not impaired—be it under legal or

illegal drugs. As a comparison, alcohol is legal, but one cannot drink it on the job.

Drug Testing

Employers still have the right to conduct pre-employment drug testing, as well as reasonable suspicion testing if a stated policy is in place.

Testing for marijuana, however, is more

problematic than for other drugs. The drug stays in the body's system far longer than other drugs or alcohol, and the results are not as precise.

Marijuana in the Workplace

There appears to be some confusion on employees' part. They may think that employers can't fire employees now that marijuana is legal, but employers still can enforce employment policies as there is nothing in the law which

states that an employer has to accommodate the marijuana usage.

Other predictable problems come up, including the possibility that employees might "indulge" during their meal breaks.

It must be stressed that using marijuana while driving is just as illegal as using



alcohol while driving. A new state law makes smoking marijuana while driving or riding as a passenger illegal—a move to combat a type of intoxicated driving officials fear may become more common and more dangerous.

The best practice might be to freely inform your employees of these issues. Any ambiguities need to be clarified, and employees need to be aware of the consequences of indulging while at work.

I had the honor and privilege of being chosen by my peers in the California Moving and Storage Industry to serve as Chairman of the largest and most active trade association of its kind in the U.S. from 1985-1986.

My year as Chairman was very eventful and historical in the long history of CMSA, which this year is celebrating its 100th year of serving members of the moving and storage industry in addition to the public they serve.

The highlights of that year involved challenges to the CMSA that were both unpleasant and strengthening to its long history of being a truly representative and advocating organization, looking out for the interests of our industry. Just a few months after being sworn in as Chairman at the historic Hotel Del Coronado in San Diego during the 1985

CMSA Convention, I was tasked with accepting the resignation of longtime CMSA President **Tom Hays**.

Another challenge my Board of Directors was forced to deal with was dealing with the bank's foreclosure of the building owned by the CMSA in Sunnyvale, CA and its subsequent relocation to an office in Seal Beach, CA. I will always remember fondly the words of **Jim Shurr** at the start of a board meeting, "Are we having fun yet?"

One of the pleasurable events of my administration as Chairman was working with a search committee of CMSA leaders and board members in hiring a new president, Doug Hill. Doug served as one of the most active and effective CMSA President's in its history from 1985 until his retirement in 2005.

Another memorable event, to me, was nominating **Barbara Marcantonio** to become the first Chairwoman of the CMSA. I nominated **Barbara** while serving as Senior Chairman of the Board in 1986, after my year as chairman had expired.

As your California Moving and Storage Association commemorate its 100th anniversary at this years' convention I have and always will consider it a milestone and one of the greatest achievements in my life.

To be listed as one of those persons who has been blessed to serve the moving and storage industry in California as Chairman, I stand in awe when I think about many of our industry's giants that preceded me; leaders such as Ralph T. Rolapp, Richard Schmitz, Robert Foy, Robert Menne, Jack Macy, Larry Meredith and James Shurr, to name but a few that have served.

I wish you a happy 100th birthday California Moving & Storage Association, and many hundreds more.




