

PRESIDENT'S COMMENTS

Anyone who has been following industry events can surely appreciate how busy 2020 has started for the business of the Association. The number one question since fall 2019, and sure to remain

number one for 2020, is what is the status of AB 5? More accurately, what is the status of California Labor Code modified effective January 1, 2020 by California Assembly Bill 5 authored by Assemblywoman Lorena Gonzalez, passed by the legislature and signed into law by Governor Newsom in 2019? For simplicity and brevity, we will continue to use AB 5 to discuss the issue.

First, there are several key points to remember whenever the Association or its representatives discuss or present legal issues, specifically outside of our expertise related to the MAX 4 and California Mover regulatory issues as defined by the House-


hold Movers Act in the California Business and Professions Code.

- ed for the business of the Association. The number one question since fall 2019, and sure to remain 2019.
  - 3. AB 5 IS UNSETTLED LAW AND YOUR OWN CIRCUMSTANCES MAY PLAY A ROLE IN POTENTIAL OUTCOMES.

Additionally, this is a dynamic issue with new information coming out from many sources. Therefore, it will be some time before anyone can say this question is resolved. We must also remain alert to the possibility that some information, from any source, related to this complex and specialized area of the law will be erroneous.

In less than 10 days since December 31, 2019, we have seen a lot of action related to AB 5. A federal district court judge issued an order granting a temporary restraining

order (TRO) enjoining the State Attorney General and relevant state enforcement agencies from enforcing AB 5 as to any motor carrier operating in California. The case

was brought by the California Trucking Association (CTA). A follow-up hearing on the TRO is scheduled for January 13<sup>th</sup>, after which the TRO may contin-



ue or the federal district court may further clarify its opinion on the issue. In a separate case, a California Superior Court judge issued an order granting a motion in limine regarding federal preemption and non-retroactivity of AB 5's "ABC" worker classification test. Relevant here, the Superior Court judge concluded that, "[b]ecause Prong B of the ABC Test under both *Dynamex* and AB 5 prohibits motor carriers from using independent contractors to provide trans-

portation services, the ABC Test has an impermissible effect on motor carriers' 'prices [s], routes[s] [and] services' and is preempted by the FAAAA." Which "motor carriers" would be affected by federal FAAAA preemption (interstate, intrastate, freight, household goods) is not 100% clear yet. Additionally. Uber, the party that declared that the legislation originally designed to address their business model didn't apply to them. sent an email to their customers in early January that they were making changes to their model in 2020. They would be switching from a model of set prices to a model of estimated prices with final pricing based upon time and distance of service provided.



Separately, over the last several months CMSA has worked with the Bureau of Household Goods and Services (BHGS) to

Together let's make this a fun and memorable convention. Please register this week and buy your airline tickets pronto.





BHGS staff provided us with draft information, early enough for us to ensure that the calculations and amended language was correct. Thankfully, the Bureau's professionalism made our efforts far easier that in several past years, they also had the document posted on their website on the first day of

the year! With the finalization of the 2020 MAX 4 Tariff, CMSA has worked with Milburn Printing on a revised Combined Agreement for Moving Services and Freight Bill that is currently available for purchase.

With all that's going on this year, you don't want to miss being a part of CMSA's 102nd annual convention. Register today and come make memories in flip flops!


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### **Interstate Trucking gets Temporary Relief from New Law Restricting Independent Contractors**

On the final day of 2019, California Southern District Judge, Roger Benitez granted a temporary restraining order on the enforcement of California's controversial AB 5 law which was slated to go into effect January 1. In his decision, he wrote that the California Trucking Association (CTA)

the case was. "likely to succeed on the merits" and that the plaintiffs are, "likely to suf-



fer irreparable harm in the absence of relief." This restraining order prevents the state of California from enforcing AB 5 until an upcoming hearing on January 13.

The lawsuit, which was filed by the CTA in November, challenges AB 5, specifically the "B" prong of the "ABC" test. The "B"

prong prohibits companies from using independent contractors unless they are performing work outside the usual course of the hiring entity's business. If CTA's preliminary injunction is successful, California would be unable to enforce AB 5 on trucking entities until their lawsuit is resolved; which may take months or years.

The lawsuit argues that California AB 5 is preempted by the supremacy and commerce clauses in the U.S. Constitution and is in conflict with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Act and the FAA Act of 1994. Specifically, the 1994 law bans states from enacting laws that affect a motor carrier prices, routes or services. California AB 5 would have a severe and immediate impact on the hiring practices, cost of pricing for services and routes companies would be willing to take under this new restrictive law.

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
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# California Consumer Privacy Act (CCPA) FACT SHEET



The California Consumer Privacy Act (CCPA) was enacted in 2018 and takes effect on January 1, 2020. This landmark piece of legislation secures new privacy rights for California consumers. On October 10, 2019, Attorney General Xavier Becerra released draft regulations under the CCPA for public comment.

The CCPA grants new rights to California consumers

- The **right to know** what personal information is collected, used, shared or sold, both as to the categories and specific pieces of personal information;
- The right to delete personal information held by businesses and by extension, a business's service provider;
- The **right to opt-out** of sale of personal information. Consumers are able to direct a business that sells personal information to stop selling that information. Children under the age of 16 must provide opt in consent, with a parent or guardian consenting for children under 13.
- The **right to non-discrimination** in terms of price or service when a consumer exercises a privacy right under CCPA.

The CCPA applies to certain businesses

- Businesses are subject to the CCPA if one or more of the following are true:
  - Has gross annual revenues in excess of \$25 million;
  - Buys, receives, or sells the personal information of 50,000 or more consumers, households, or devices;
  - Derives 50 percent or more of annual revenues from selling consumers' personal information.
- As proposed by the draft regulations, businesses that handle the personal information of more than 4 million consumers will have additional obligations.

The CCPA imposes new business obligations

- Businesses subject to the CCPA must provide notice to consumers at or before data collection.
- Businesses must create procedures to respond to requests from consumers to optout, know, and delete.
  - For requests to opt-out, businesses must provide a "Do Not Sell My Info" link on their website or mobile app.
- Businesses must **respond** to requests from consumers to know, delete, and opt-out within specific timeframes.
  - As proposed by the draft regulations, businesses must treat user-enabled privacy settings that signal a consumer's choice to opt-out as a validly submitted opt-out request.
- Businesses must verify the identity of consumers who make requests to know and to delete, whether or not the consumer maintains a password-protected account with the business.
  - As proposed by the draft regulations, if a business is unable to verify a request, it may deny the request, but must comply to the greatest extent it can. For example, it must treat a request to delete as a request to opt-out.
- As proposed by the draft regulations, businesses must disclose financial incentives

offered in exchange for the retention or sale of a consumer's personal information and explain how they calculate the value of the personal information. Businesses must also explain how the incentive is permitted under the CCPA.

- As proposed by the draft regulations, businesses must maintain records of requests and how they responded for 24 months in order to demonstrate their compliance.
  - In addition, businesses that collect, buy, or sell the personal information of more than 4 million consumers have additional record-keeping and training obligations.

### Tim Helenthal Takes Reigns as CEO & Chairman

Van Lines in 1929. Maureen retired Dec. 31. "I suppose there's never a perfect time to retire, but we did time this transition perfectly," Maureen Beal said. "Tim's quartercentury of moving-industry experience, plus his sharp insight, will elevate the National Van Lines brand in consumers' minds as we navigate an increasingly competitive environment."

"This is a pivotal period in the movingand-storage industry," Tim said. "We're confronting a nationwide driver shortage while technology is moving us toward driverless vehicles. At the same time, human capital is a tremendously important part of the business—and will remain so indefinitely. We're also facing challenges with corporations instituting remote-work policies that allow employees to stay put and not hire cross-

Tim's scope extends beyond NVL's corporate boundaries. He was the International Association of Movers' Vice -Chairman before his 2017 election to Chairman and two subsequent re-elections. He's on the Board of Directors for the American Moving & Storage Association and serves on that organization's Government Traffic Committee. In the military sector, Tim serves on the newly formed Personal Property Executive Working

Group created by the United States Transportation Command.

A supporter of the hunger-battling group, Move For Hunger, Tim and his daughter, Lauren, set a Move For Hunger fundraising record by generating \$6,721 in donations during the 2016 Rock 'n' Roll Chicago Half Marathon.

Tim lives in suburban Chicago with his wife, Danielle, and has three daughters. He eagerly cheers for the St. Louis Cardinals, especially when they're up against the Chicago Cubs. He also enjoys running, reading and family time.

He attended Eastern Illinois University in Charleston, IL where he received a B.A. in economics in 1990 and an M.A. in economics in 1991.



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### California Court decides in favor of Defendants Motion in Limine regarding Preemption and Non-Retroactivity of ABC Workers Classification Test

A California court ruled Wednesday in favor of keeping big-rig truck drivers as independent contractors versus turning them into company employees, a decision that

could bode well for other industries in their fight against the newly enacted state gig worker law AB 5.

The Los Angeles
County Superior Court
decision in the state of
California vs. Cal Cartage Transportation Express case upheld the
Federal Aviation Administration Authorization Act (FAAAA) of 1994.

"After careful consideration, the court agrees with defendants that the currently

operative legal requirements for determination of employee versus independent contractor status are preempted as to certain motor carriers and their drivers by an act of

Congress," the court stated in its ruling.
The federal law is designed to allow commerce to flow freely across state lines, "increase competition" and "reduce the cost of trucking services" by allowing truckers to forego changing their status as independent contractor on a state-by

-state basis.

We will continue to follow this and other relevant cases and update as necessary.


