### **FMCSA Launches Operation Protect Your Move.** A Nationwide Crackdown on Moving Scams

Tuesday, April 4, 2023 -- Ahead of busy summer season, agency conducts enforcement sweep to stop fraudsters from holding household goods hostage

**WASHINGTON --**

The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) today announced the launch of Operation Protect Your Move, a nationwide crackdown on scam movers ahead of the busy summer moving season. Through Operation Protect Your Move, FMCSA is deploying dozens of investigators across the

country in an enforcement sweep to address the significant uptick in complaints of movers holding household possessions hostage to extort exorbitant additional charges from consumers. It will also address complaints against moving companies

and brokers that are not in compliance with federal safety and consumer protection regulations and statutes while transporting household goods. The Operation covers

> both movers and the brokers that purport to connect consumers to local movers but instead facilitate fraud by promoting scams.

"Moving is stressful enough without having to worry about being scammed by your moving company, so we're cracking down on moving companies that hold people's possessions hostage, and the brokers who facili-

tate that fraud," said U.S. Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg. "If you're planning a move, we encourage you to visit protectyourmove.gov for more information to help protect yourself from moving

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

"FMCSA takes its responsibilities very seriously to help protect consumers when moving their household valuables from one state to another," says FMCSA Administrator Robin Hutcheson. "Consumers should

feel confident they can trust the company hired to transport their possessions."

Frequent complaints have been filed with FMCSA alleging companies of using deceptive business practices that are causing consum-

ers to pay higher fees, experience delays in receiving their household goods, or in some cases not receiving their possessions at all. FMCSA is making every effort to protect consumers from these moving scams. The agency will formally document violations and has the authority to review and revoke the licenses of movers and brokers. Cases involving potential criminal misconduct may be referred to the U.S. Department of Justice for further investigation. Additionally, FMCSA will work directly with consumers to guide them through the process and help get their

money and goods back.

The Operation is the first of many efforts planned over the next several months to address non-compliant household goods moving companies and brokers. In addition to ramped-up investigations, FMCSA is taking several actions to crack down on mover

scams, including doubling the number of investigators assigned to moving complaints and enhancing partnerships with consumer protection and attorney general offices across the country.

**FMCSA** also

provides important information on its website at <a href="https://nccdb.fmcsa.doc.">www.ProtectYourMove.gov</a> for consumers planning an interstate move. Consumers can download a moving checklist, view videos on spotting red flags, confirm a mover or broker's registration with FMCSA, and check the number of complaints against a particular company. Consumers can also file a complaint against a company regulated by FMCSA by visiting the agency's National Consumer Complaints Database (NCCDB) at <a href="https://nccdb.fmcsa.dot.gov">https://nccdb.fmcsa.dot.gov</a>.

## EPA OKs California Rules Phasing Out New Diesel Trucks

Manufacturers Must Sell Higher Percentage of Zero-Emission Vehicles Starting in 2024

The <u>U.S. Environmental Protection</u>
<u>Agency</u> has granted California environmental regulators waivers to officially move forward with the agency's aggressive plans to transition diesel trucks to electric vehicles and expand the length of truck warranties.

Specifically, the EPA's waiver approval gives the California Air Resources Board permission to adopt its Advanced Clean Trucks Regulation that requires manufacturers to produce and sell increasing quantities of medium- and heavy-duty zero-emission trucks in California.

The <u>2018 Heavy-Duty Warranty amend-ments</u>, also approved by EPA, will extend the emissions warranty periods for 2022 and subsequent model year on-road heavy-duty diesel engines and for 2022 and sub-

sequent model year diesel vehicles with a gross vehicle weight rating exceeding 14,000 pounds powered by such engines.

Under the Clean Air Act, California is afforded broad discretion to adopt emissions requirements to meet its significant air quali-

ty challenges, but it must seek waivers from EPA for new motor vehicle emission standards. The state has the dirtiest air in the nation.

"In this instance, CARB requested two waivers for regulations relating to heavy duty vehicles and engines," EPA said in a March 31 release. "After reviewing the technical information provided by CARB, reviewing comments submitted by the public, and applying the limited authority for review un-

der section 209 of the Clean Air Act. EPA determined it appropriate to grant the waiver and authorization requests."

"Under the Clean Air Act, California has long-standing authority to address pollution from cars and trucks," said EPA Administrator Michael Regan. "Today's announcement allows the state to take additional steps in reducing their transportation emissions through these new regulatory actions."

CARB announced its request for a federal waiver in June, and EPA held a two-day hearing to solicit input on the regulations. The state agency's plan has not been wellreceived by many in the trucking industry.

> American Trucking Associations President Chris Spear said in a release that the decision to allow California to move forward with what he described as, "damaging and unrealistic" emissions rules will harm the industry nationwide.

"By granting California's waiver for its so-called

'advanced clean trucks' rule, the EPA is handing over the keys as a national regulator," Spear said. "This isn't the United States of California, and in order to mollify a neversatisfied fringe environmental lobby by allowing the state to proceed with these technologically infeasible rules on unworkable and unrealistic timelines, the EPA is sowing the ground for a future supply chain crisis."

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

### House Lawmakers Introduce Bill to **Protect Moving Privacy**

Senate Already Passed Version

Legislation meant to safeguard certain identifiable information of individuals moving internationally was recently introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives.

This month, Reps. Mike Waltz (R-Fla.) and Bill Pascrell (D-N.J.) introduced the bipartisan

Moving Americans Privacy Protection Act.

The bill would require U.S. Customs and Border Protection to remove personally identifiable information from cargo manifests before public disclosure. Such information includes Social Security and passport numbers. The measure is specific to individuals



moving internationally with household goods.

"The personal information of every American should be safe and secure," said Waltz, a member of the Armed Services Committee, on March 10. "However, due to the current public disclosure of cargo manifests, our service mem-

bers and their families experience a higher risk of identity theft and fraud as they move abroad."

"It is critical we take the necessary steps to protect them against dangerous and fraudulent activity," the Florida Republican added. "That's why I am proud to introduce

legislation in the House to secure international travel and help safeguard the livelihoods of Americans."

"In the modern world, protecting privacy is a difficult, constantly evolving challenge. This is especially true for our brave service-members protecting America's interests abroad who are increasingly victims of identity theft," observed Pascrell, a member of the Ways and Means panel on tax policy. "This common-sense measure would protect Americans from accidentally having their own information end up in the wrong hands. I am proud to co-lead this bipartisan legislation designed to support our servicemembers and their families."

According to background information about the bill its sponsors provided, "In recent years, [personally identifiable information] of relocating individuals has been released, enabling identity theft, credit card fraud and unwanted solicitations. [U.S. Customs and Border Protection] does offer a process for consumers of shipping services

to make their information confidential. However, these forms [typically] take two months to process and are often processed after the individual has moved. Consumers should not have to request the confidentiality of their [personally identifiable information], it should be the default."

"This legislation would simply amend the manifest disclosure process to explicitly require the removal of individuals' [personally identifiable information], such as names, addresses, Social Security numbers, and passport numbers," per the background about the bill.

The bill's consideration in the GOP-led chamber has yet to be scheduled by floor managers.

On the other side of the Capitol, Sens. Steve Daines (R-Mont.) and Gary Peters (D-Mich.) introduced a Senate-passed version of the bill. The chamber, led by Democrats, approved the measure on March 9.

"Montanans' private, personal information should never be jeopardized just because they're moving or traveling abroad. Safe-

guarding Americans from identity theft and fraud is a top priority of mine. I'm glad to

see my common-sense, bipartisan bill pass the U.S. Senate," Daines said soon after the bill's passage. He is a member of the Finance Committee on tax policy.

"Identify theft is costly and disruptive to the lives of people in Michigan and across the country," noted Peters, chairman of the Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee. "Removing sensitive personal infor-

mation from manifests will help protect Americans who are moving back from abroad from fraud, while maintaining safe and secure international travel and trade."

Key stakeholders are endorsing the bipartisan legislation. "Americans shouldn't be

at increased risk of identity theft because they are returning home after an overseas military deployment or job posting," Ryan

Bowley, executive director of American Trucking Associations' Moving and Storage Conference, said in a statement accompanying the bill's introduction.

"This legislation will address this long-standing problem by ensuring the government is not inadvertently enabling the sale of personal information to data brokers or those with ill intent. Americans trust movers to

move the household goods, and we thank Rep. Waltz and Rep. Pascrell for working to protect the privacy and security of Americans' personal data," Bowley added.

#### Moving Americans Privacy Protection Act

In light of recent increases in identify theft, the Moving Americans Privacy
Protection Act seeks to protect the personally identifiable information (PII) of those
who make international moves with their household goods.

U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) requires manifest sheets in order to disclose and document the cargo of incoming vessels for customs and security purposes. In 1984, the public disclosure of certain manifest information was required. The original intent of this provision was to increase competition, to facilitate better public analysis of import trends, and allow port authorities and transportation companies to more easily identify potential customers and changes in their industries. However, in recent years, PII of relocating individuals has been released, enabling identity theft, credit card fraud, and unwanted solicitations. CBP does offer a process for consumers of shipping services to make their information confidential. However, these forms typical take two months to process and are often processed after the individual has moved. Consumers should not have to request the confidentiality of their PII, it should be the default.

This legislation would simply amend the manifest disclosure process to explicitly require the removal of individuals' PII, such as names, addresses, social security numbers, and passport numbers. This protects the original intent of manifest disclosures and protects PII.

Because California has the nation's worst air, it sets strict and often controversial standards to meet "compelling and extraordinary conditions," according to the state's environmental officials. However, for decades EPA has generally agreed to grant the waivers to the state, which require it to implement standards that are at least as protective as federal standards.

Under the new rules, truck manufacturers who certify Class 2b-8 chassis or complete vehicles with combustion engines must sell zero-emission trucks as an increasing percentage of their annual California sales starting in 2024. By 2035, zero-emission truck/chassis sales must account for 55% of Class 2b-3 truck sales, 75% of Class 4-8 straight truck sales and 40% of truck tractor sales, according to CARB.


The new regulations have received support from state air quality officials nationwide, but a number of motor carriers and truck trade organizations have joined ATA in cautioning that the rule is moving forward too fast.

Tweaks to the CARB rule are being planned to allow for certain exemptions when electric trucks are not available to meet deadlines.

The regulation also lengthens the useful life and emission warranty of heavy-duty diesel engines for use in vehicles with a gross vehicle weight rating greater than 10,000 pounds.

EPA has also conducted a public comment process regarding CARB's Heavy-Duty Omnibus Low NOx Regulation which establishes criteria pollutant exhaust emission standards for nitrogen oxide and particulate matter as well as other emission-related requirements for new 2024 and subsequent model year on-road medium- and heavy-duty engines and vehicles. CARB has asked EPA for additional time before the agency acts on the waiver request for the Omnibus regulation. EPA expects to act upon this waiver request as appropriate.

The CARB board is expected to vote on adopting the Advanced Clean Fleets Regulation sometime in late April.


