California Offers Online CDL Renewals

California has made it easier for truck drivers to renew their commercial driver li-

censes through a new online option that is part of the state's ongoing customer-focused digital transformation.

"The online CDL renewal service is intended to make it easier for commercial drivers to renew their

license and get back on the road quickly to move California's economy forward. The service is also intended to make the DMV more efficient by reducing wait times and maximizing existing resources," said Ronald Ongtoaboc, spokesperson for the executive division of the state's Department of Motor Vehicles.

Each year, the DMV processes an average of 209,000 CDL renewals.

Now eligible CDL holders can renew their licenses online without having to go to DMV

offices, which streamlines the renewal process and eliminates delays.

Ongtoaboc said the DMV "is still evaluating potential savings with the online [CDL] renewal process, but such savings would be tied to efficiencies being

wou effice made in other areas."

According to the DMV, California's commercial driving sector is critical to the movement of regional goods and services, which emphasizes the importance of having efficient transportation of essential commodities in such industries as agriculture, manufacturing and retail.

"The convenience of the online CDL re-

The transition of California moving regulations from the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to the California Department of Consumer Affairs, Bureau of Household Goods and Services


(BHGS) is one of the major successes of our Association. The impact the California Moving and Storage Association (CMSA) had and continues to have on the transfer from one agency to another could not have been matched by any individual company or smaller industry group. We continue to support BHGS in developing and implementing their major information technology project, including the Connect initiative that will allow all permitted movers to review their regulatory status and history and pay quarterly fees. The electronic payment of quarterly fees is a project that CMSA has been lobbying for even before our transfer from the

CPUC.

During February, I had the opportunity to conduct a MAX 4 Tariff presentation to the BHGS enforcement staff. I was impressed by their knowledge and questions. We even had the chance to discuss issues related to Restoration Companies, another area of BHGS regulations. Both BHGS and the CMSA agree that a Cal-T number and Bureau regulations are required in this area.

February also saw the passing of the scholarship application process and the review by our program evaluator. This extremely successful program, the largest in our industry in both annual awards and cumulative total, is only made possible by the support of our membership through chapter fundraising events. Occasionally, someone will bemoan the frequency of chapter emails or events themselves! Maybe they have never had the child or grandchild of a member of their team receive a CMSA scholarship. These awards are financially beneficial, but the recognition can mean even more to some young people. CMSA Chap-



newal service underscores the state's recognition of the significance of commercial drivers and their pivotal role in supporting the smooth operation of the world's fifth-largest economy," DMV noted.

The DMV has been launching numerous

online efficiency improvements for the state's trucking industry. In September 2022, the DMV began moving from a paper-based process to score CDL drive tests to an electronic method using iPads.

"The transition was done in phases starting with the

DMV's Commercial Drive Test Centers and then moving to other offices offering CDL drive tests. By February 2023, all DMV field offices offering CDL drive tests were scoring exams utilizing iPads," Ongtoaboc said.

California DMV examiners were among the first in the nation to use electronic tablets to administer exams, which eliminates the use of paper score sheets and computer data entry. The DMV has also modernized the skills test to streamline the exam process. These improvements help get more qualified drivers on the road faster to benefit California's economy. The DMV has administered 127,000 CDL drive tests using the iPads so far.

"The reaction from DMV examiners and management has been positive. The electronic platform saves time by sending information directly to the Commercial Skills Test Information Management System and retaining data, which can be used to ensure the offices are meeting service expectations,"

Ongtoaboc said.

He noted that customer feedback has been positive about DMV innovations, which allow the DMV to conduct more CDL tests each day.

The DMV has taken many steps to offer more digital services and encourages all customers to

use its online services and other service channels to complete transactions, including eligible driver's license and vehicle registration renewals.

The DMV has more than doubled the number of services available online to 48 to-day from 20 in 2019, while also reducing transaction times by two-thirds and eliminating obstacles for staff to process transactions more quickly. At the same time, DMV has provided customers with necessary tools that are resulting in lower wait times for office visits than in the past.

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FMCSA Warns About Fake Safety Audit Scam

FMCSA says the phishing emails include what appears to be a SAFER URL and mirrors FMCSA's MC-150.

istration is warning motor carriers of an email phishing scam involving a fake DOT safety audit.

An email is being sent to registered motor carriers by someone pretending to be FMCSA and notifying the recipient that they need to schedule a safety audit. The link to request the safety audit has what appears to be a SAFER URL and mirrors FMCSA's MC-150, but includes fields to enter a PIN #, EIN #, and Social Security Number.

Phishing e-mails masquerade as being from reputable companies or entities in order to get the recipient to reveal personal information, such as passwords and credit card numbers. In this case, some of the information being requested is not only sensi-

The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Admin- Itive personal information that could be used for purposes such as identity theft, but this information would also allow the unauthorized party to gain access to your FMCSA account.

> The agency says the email containing the link is very convincing as coming from FMCSA.

FMCSA explains that communications relating to safety audits will typically come directly from an FMCSA dedicated mailbox, or from the state entity that has been assigned the responsibility to conduct the safety audit. While these emails typically end in a ".gov", FMCSA recommends that you verify any potentially suspicious email or communication with the appropriate agency or contact your FMCSA Division Office directly to clarify.



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New Jersey Lawmakers Raise Minimum Insurance

Truckers Oppose Increase to \$1.5 Million

The New Jersey Legislature has passed

a law requiring heavy trucks to carry a minimum \$1.5 million in liability insurance — double the current federal minimum insurance requirement of \$750,000.


Under the new law, the owner or a registered owner of

a commercial motor vehicle weighing more than 26,000 pounds will be required to maintain motor vehicle liability insurance coverage of at least \$1.5 million to insure against loss resulting from liability imposed by law for bodily injury, death and property damage. Earlier attempts to pass the law, which

goes into effect July
1, were hung up in
the Legislature for
more than a year before the bill was
signed into law by
Democratic Gov. Phil
Murphy on Jan. 16.
Its primary sponsor
was Nicholas Scutari, president of the
state's senate, who


also is an attorney.

The current Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration standard requiring carriers to maintain a minimum of \$750,000 in liability insurance has been in place since 1985. Alt-

Question:

Can a California-based trucking company test its drivers for marijuana usage? Answer from Copilot (Microsoft Windowsbased Artificial Intelligence):

hough the agency has kicked around the notion of raising the insurance minimum requirement, in a 2022 report it concluded it could not find the justification to do so.

"In order for FMCSA to adequately assess the sufficiency of the financial responsibility requirements, the agency would need access to more detailed information from the insurance industry, including anonymized claims data," the report said.

Although there are clear indications that

litigation jury verdicts and settlements are on the rise, "catastrophic motor carrier crashes are relatively rare," according to a 2013 study by the <u>John A. Volpe National Transportation Systems Center</u> cited in the FMCSA report.

The law has faced strong opposition from such trade groups as <u>American Trucking Associations</u>, the <u>New Jersey Motor Truck Association</u>, the <u>Truck Renting and Leasing Association</u>, the <u>New Jersey Warehouse</u>

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

and Movers Association, and others.

It does not specifically say whether the law is intended to just cover New Jerseybased carriers, or interstate carriers conducting business in the state.

ATA has called the new law, at a minimum "bad policy," and has cautioned if interstate truckers passing through or doing business in the state were subject to the law it could result in a legal challenge.

Insurance Stories

Jennifer Blazovic, interim executive director of the state trucking association, said

members have not yet determined how the bill will impact motor carriers in the state. "We're still working on it."

The group has from the beginning opposed the new law.

Blazovic said her association is still trying to get firm answers as to who must carry the higher requirement — New Jersey-based carriers or any carriers traveling through the state.

"As far as the impact goes, the majority of our members have \$2 million or more in

insurance," Blazovic said. "So the impact on our members might not be as great as with others."

"There's just no precedent on this," said ATA General Counsel Richard Pianka. "There's nothing very clear in statute. We don't really know what the scope of the law is even meant to be. But it appears to be meant for vehicles registered or principally garaged in New Jersey."

Pianka added, "We're not in favor of arbitrary increases. If the data shows that they should go up, then that's one thing. But it's another thing if the plaintiff's bar wants to make sure everybody's pockets are bigger when they want to bring a claim. That's certainly what drives a lot of the discussion around this issue."

<u>Tracy Denora</u>, executive director of the New Jersey Warehouse and Movers Association, said it's very likely the new law will cause insurance premiums to rise.


"It's going to cost at least \$20,000 to \$40,000 or more each year, up to a 20% in-

crease," Denora said. "What's going to happen now is that when motor carriers are sued, plaintiff attorneys will be going for higher verdicts and settlements. It's going to especially hurt small mover motor carriers."

"If the new law applies to out-of-state carriers doing business in the state it could be open to court actions since it would be in violation of FMCSA's requirement," said <u>Greg Feary</u>, managing partner of the Indianapolis-based transportation law firm of <u>Scopelitis</u>, <u>Garvin</u>, <u>Light</u>, <u>Hanson & Feary</u>. "So if they enforce it by stopping and impounding vehicles or fining carriers, I think that's a problem."

"Any increase in these minimum insurance levels will lead to a dramatic increase in insurance premiums for all trucking companies," the Truck Rental and Leasing Association wrote in a letter last month to Scutari, a Democrat. "FMCSA has set the national standards of interstate commerce based on a series of studies and statistics that find that over 99% of all accidents are covered by the \$750,000 limit."


